Ms. Canady has taught at Georgetown University and The Catholic University of America. She is a graduate of Duke Ellington School of the Arts. She holds a B.A. in Theater/African-American Studies from Fordham University and an M.A. in Arts Politics from New York University Tisch School of the Arts. She is a member of the Producer's Guild of America, Actor's Equity Association, and Parent Artist Advocacy League for the Performing Arts for Artists and Media.
